## **Presidents Corner**

How can we help? This is a question we hear nearly every day and we probably ask our customers every day. Customer satisfaction is the driving force behind what we do for our clients in business and is the driving force behind your chapter board, committee members and chapter volunteers. We need to keep asking our membership how we can help you so we make being a chapter member worthwhile for you.

So how do we know what you want and whether you are satisfied? One way is through our annual member survey. Each August for the past several years we have surveyed our entire West Michigan Chapter membership on various topics such as he web site, newsletter, educational programs, tours, and other chapter events. The response rate from the members has been in the 30%+ range, which is good, but I hope for over 50% member response some day. We take your answers into the board member annual planning meeting and use it as a basis to look for ways to improve our service levels to you, the members.

One way that we try to improve is through educational programs that target the topics of interest highlighted in the survey. Our Program Committee reviews the list of topics and tries to find speakers who can offer a quality program on a specific topic. I think we are beginning to do a better job of that. How can I tell? Well, the attendance numbers have been over 40 for the last two chapter programs and I have been getting good feedback after the events. It's a good start and we want to keep the momentum going.

Another way is to try new things beyond the basic educational events and tours. This year we are trying something new, the Member Expo on April 19<sup>th</sup>. By the time you read this newsletter the event may have already been completed and I hope was a success. Gauging success will be difficult since it is a first time event, but I have some ideas that I want to confirm. First, I hope we have at least 25 member exhibitors filling the tables at the ATC. Second, I hope we have another 30 members in attendance in the Expo and at the three breakout topics. Third, I hope that all associations we collaborate with (AFE, AIA, BOMA, CSI, IIDA, and USGBC) have some representation in attendance at the Expo. Fourth, I hope we have 100 total attendees throughout the afternoon in the Expo and at the breakouts. Fifth, I hope that some attendees see the benefits of IFMA and our chapter and join after attending. Sixth, and very important, I hope we have increased member satisfaction by both our member exhibitors and member attendees.

Now don't think you have to wait until the August survey to give us feedback on how we are doing. If you have any feedback, suggestions, or just some general comments, please feel free to send a board member an email, give us a call, write us a letter, or just stop by and talk to us at the next event. We want to make sure we are doing the right things for our members. How can we help?


# **January Meeting with Bisbee Infrared**

IFMA – West Michigan's January meeting focusing on Infrared Thermography was a success. Penny Chrzan, President of Bisbee Infrared, presented to an audience of 35 local Facility Professionals, with a well versed presentation focusing on real world examples of how Infrared Thermography works.

# **Herman Miller – February Meeting**

Space planning trends was the topic or our February meeting hosted by Herman Miller at their main facility in Zeeland. Connie Garman a Corporate Workplace Strategist for Herman Miler enlightened our group with an overview of new trends in planning spaces. The focus of the topics discussed were Creating Great Places that are Human, Spirited and Purposeful, Design Values and Truth in Design – how the Herman Miller legacy guides our environments. We also got a glimpse of the new high-performance workstation.

Especially of interest was the new style of offices that transition between individual, collaborative group and community use - many of our organizations have tried to make the transition to more collaborative ways of working, but why is this transition so painful? Research suggests that the shift requires fundamental changes that many organizations may not be ready to acknowledge or equipped to accommodate. Collaborative teams can not simply be plugged into an existing organizational framework. Encouraging the types of interactions and conversations that can lead to the creation of "new meanings" requires more than location team members in the same general vicinity or hooking them all up to the local area network. By itself the design of the physical workplace cannot bring about the basic transformation required for an organization to embrace and reap the benefits of collaborative ways of working. But, facilities design can create significant barriers to

the type of activities that true collaboration requires or in combination with an organizational culture and structure that values and actively pursues collaborative effort, the environment can be used to create settings that encourage and support the behaviors and relationships that create new meanings.
