First, a little history. I activated my IFMA and West Michigan Chapter membership back in early 1994 when I became involved in warehouse facility consulting. For my first six years or so I felt the chapter operated smoothly with little change. The faces on the board were the same and the meetings seemed similar from month to month. The special events had minimal participation, but were always fun.

About the time of the new millennium, I saw changes start to slowly happen. Over the past five years the board has been infused with new and younger FM professionals. At one time we had two board members under the age of 30. About three years ago I changed jobs and had time to be active on the chapter board as VP of Public Relations. The educational events and tours have become more member-focused by using your feedback from the annual member survey. We are at 25% CFM's in our membership, the highest percentage of any IFMA chapter. Membership has slightly increased even with West Michigan in a recession. The golf outing was been a popular event and has raised thousands of dollars for student scholarships.
